EDITORIAL NOTE

The *Cambridge Historical Journal* will henceforward appear twice yearly, in March and September. The Editorial Committee have been able to make this change with the assistance of a grant generously provided by the Nuffield Foundation and allocated by the British Academy. At the same time they have determined upon some important changes in policy:

1. While maintaining the connexion with Cambridge they hope to give the *Journal* a wider, national character and have resolved to issue a general invitation for contributions from historians anywhere.
2. Believing that there is a special need for a national journal of modern history they have decided that the *Cambridge Historical Journal* should in future be predominantly, though not exclusively, a journal of modern history.
3. They have agreed that each number of the *Journal* should henceforward include a certain number of reviews of important books on modern history.

Historians who wish to submit articles for consideration or to suggest books for review are invited to communicate with the Editor, Corpus Christi College, Cambridge.
