The XII World Congress of the International Political Science Association will be held August 9-14, 1982 in Rio de Janeiro. The preliminary program was published in the Spring 1981 *PS*. This report provides information on travel grants and group travel arrangements.

TRAVEL GRANTS

American Council of Learned Societies

The American Council of Learned Societies will award approximately five travel grants to IPSA Congress participants presenting papers with humanistic topics. The amount of these awards will be one-half of the projected economy class airfare. For applications, write to Richard Schlutter, ACLS, 800 Third Avenue, New York, New York 10022. The deadline for grant applications is *March 1, 1982*.

National Science Foundation

The National Science Foundation has granted the APSA \$22,000 for travel

grants to those IPSA Congress participants presenting papers or otherwise contributing to panels with the greatest promise of increasing theoretical and empirical understanding of basic political processes. Forty-four grants of \$500 each will be awarded. The selections will be made by a committee appointed by President S. M. Lipset. To apply for an NSF travel grant, send by *March 1, 1982* a statement of your planned participation in the Congress and a curriculum vitae to IPSA/NSF Travel Grants, APSA, 1527 New Hampshire Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20036.
