SHORT COURSE IN AUDIOMETRY FOR CONSULTANT OTOLARYNGOLOGISTS

March 24th-26th, 1964

It is intended to hold a three-day non-residential course in the Principles and Practice of Clinical Audiology in the University of Manchester, from March 24th to 26th, inclusive, 1964.

The course will be provided by the Department of Audiology and Education of the Deaf in association with the Department of Otolaryngology and is intended particularly for Consultant Otologists.

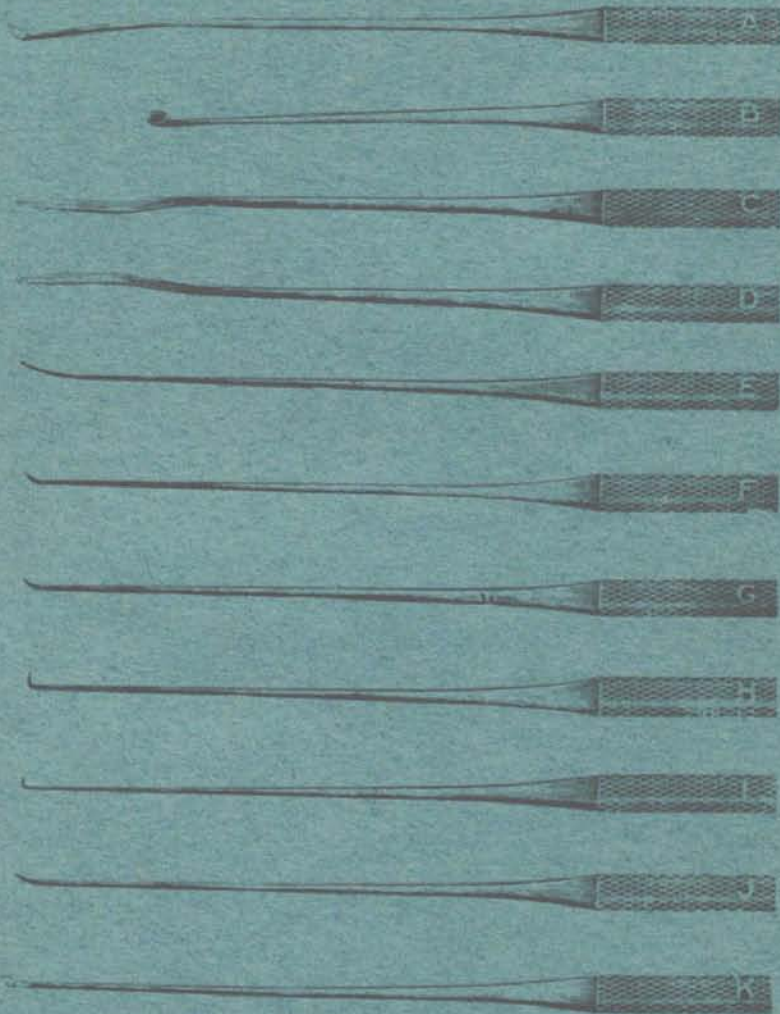
