The Idea of Revelation in Recent Thought

What do we mean by 'revelation'? This is a question, says Dr Baillie, 'to which much hard thought and careful writing are being devoted in our time'. Traditionally truths of reason, accessible to the unaided intellect, were distinguished from revealed truth authoritatively declared by God; but in modern times this distinction has been much questioned, and God's self-revelation to human minds and souls is less mechanically conceived. Dr Baillie reviews, in his own masterly fashion, a number of recent contributions to the subject, and in his hands this results in a clear-sighted and valuable contribution to the subject.
