Report on a stratified Archaic site on the shore of Lake Huron.

No. 5. **"NbVvk-1: An Historic Fishing Camp in Old Crow Flats, Northern Yukon Territory"** by *Richard E. Morlan*. 44 p., 11 figures, 5 tables. 75¢

Description and analysis of artifacts, fauna and features in a small summer season occupation.

No. 6. **"Archaeology of the Lake Harbour District, Baffin Island"** by *Moreau S. Maxwell*. 362 p., 72 figures, 36 tables. \$4.00

Examination of a number of Pre-Dorset and Dorset sites ranging from 2,500 B.C. to A.D. 480. Little cultural change is seen within the transition from Pre-Dorset to Dorset.

No. 7. "A Technological Approach to Lithic Artifacts from Yukon Territory" by Richard E. Morlan. 44 p., 21 figures, 1 table. \$1.00

A list of 26 categories for the descriptive presentation of the morphological and technological attributes of stone artifacts from Yukon Territory.

No. 8. "The Roebuck Prehistoric Village Site Rim Sherds – An Attribute Analysis" by James F. Pendergast. 59 p., 6 figures, 14 tables. \$1.00

An attribute analysis of the rim sherds from a St. Lawrence Iroquois Roebuck site in south-eastern Ontario.

No. 9. "Haida Burial Practices: Three Archaeological Examples; The Gust Island Burial Shelter, The Skungo Cave North Island, Mass Burials from Tanu" by George F. MacDonald and "The Gust Island Burial Shelter: Physical Anthropology" by Jerome S. Cybulski. 113 p., 32 plates, 2 figures, 10 tables. \$2.00

Part I is an analysis of Haida mortuary practices using data from historical sources and from three excavated burial locations. Part II is the osteological analysis of one of these sites – The Gust Island burial shelter, Queen Charlotte Islands, B.C.

No. 11. "The Later Prehistory of the Middle Porcupine Drainage, Northern Yukon Territory" by Richard E. Morlan. 583 p., 24 plates, 46 figures, 81 tables. \$5.50

Description and analysis of artifacts and faunal remains from the Klo-kut site. Other sites in the middle Porcupine drainage, northern Yukon Territory, are also mentioned in an attempt to reconstruct the subsistence economy, annual cycle, and settlement patterns of the late prehistoric Kutchin Indians.

No. 12. "Cow Point: An Archaic Cemetery in New Brunswick" by David Sanger. 214 p., 20 plates, 6 figures, 29 tables, 11 histograms. \$2.75

A detailed description and analysis of an Archaic cemetery near Grand Lake, New Brunswick.

No. 13. "Archaeological Investigations in the Hecate Strait – Milbanke Sound Area of British Columbia" by Bjorn O. Simonsen. 117 p., 23 figures, 1 table. \$1.75

Results of archaeological investigations in 1969 in the Hecate Strait – Milbanke Sound area of British Columbia, including the excavation report for FcTe-4, a site occupied continuously for 3,500 years.

No. 14. "The Archaeology and Prehistory of Southern Alberta as Reflected by Ceramics" by William J. Byrne. Three volumes, 729 p., 27 plates, 42 figures, 28 tables. \$8.50

This three volume monograph contains a detailed review of the aboriginal ceramics of southern Alberta, as well as an interpretation of late prehistoric, protohistoric and ethnohistoric developments on the Canadian plains as reflected by an analysis of these ceramics.

A general synthesis of the prehistoric development of the Huron-Petun and the Neutral-Erie.

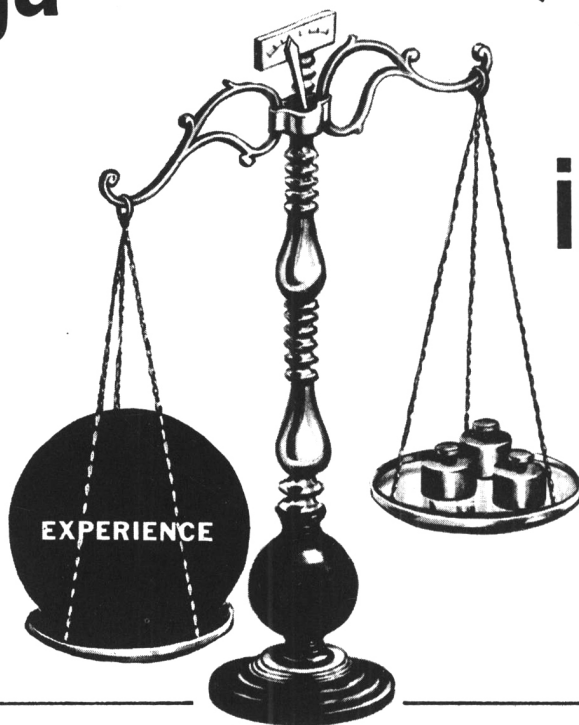
