Notes on Contributors

Professor E. Kedourie has taught at the London School of Economics since 1953 and is now a Professor of Politics and Fellow of the British Academy. His publications include *Nationalism*, first published in 1960, and *Nationalism in Asia and Africa*, published in 1970.

George Boyce is a Lecturer in Government at the University College, Swansea and was made a Fellow of the Royal Historical Society in 1973. He has had two books published, one in 1972 entitled *Englishmen and Irish Troubles* and another in 1978 entitled *Newspaper History*. At present he is working on a study of Irish Nationalist ideas.

Charles F. Doran is Professor of Political Science at Rice University. Included among his other books and articles are *The Politics of Assimilation: Hegemony and Its Aftermath* (1971) and *Myth, Oil and Politics: An Introduction to the Political Economy of Petroleum* (1977).

Kim Q. Hill is Associate Professor of Political Science at the University of Houston at Clear Lake City. He specializes in comparative politics and international relations.
