There has recently been a large crop of important reissues, either with revisions or in cheaper editions. Among the more interesting may be noted the following:

The Christology of the New Testament by Oscar Cullmann (S.C.M., 45s.) is one of the finest products of Protestant biblical theology. It examines in turn the different titles of our Lord, investigating the extent to which they are due to him or to the early Church. This new edition contains revisions of detail and a short Epilogue.

New Essays in Philosophical Theology by Antony Flew and Alastair MacIntyre is a new cheap reprint (S.C.M., 13s. 6d.) of the controversial essays in which modern English philosophers first turned to an examination of religious ideas. A great deal has been done in the eight years since it first appeared, but it is good to meet old friends and enemies once again.

The *Complete Works* of St Teresa (of Avila, naturally) in the standard translation of Allison Peers are now available in three paper-back volumes from Sheed and Ward, price 10s. 6d. each.

Collin's Fontana Series now gives us Teilhard de Chardin's *Le Milieu Divin* at 3s. 6d. To the Teilhardian, here is the great man magnificently turning to the non-controversial field of Christian devotion; to the un-Teilhardian, here are the same old mistakes subconsciously destructive even there. Read it to find out for yourselves.

Cardinal Suenen's fine book, the *Nun in the World* now appears in paper-back from Burns and Oates at 12s. 6d. 'New Revised Edition' we are told in bold letters on the front; but in what the revision consists, whether in the author's thought or merely the translator's, with some lack of candour we are nowhere told.
