Continuing the detailed examination of the political role of the Argentine Army that was begun in the author's *The Army and Politics in Argentina, 1928–1945: Yrigoyen to Perón*, this book deals with the nearly ten-year presidency of General Juan D. Perón, the three-year military regime known as the Liberating Revolution, and the truncated civilian government of Dr. Arturo Frondizi. A principal focus is on the changing relationships between the nation's political leaders and officers of the Army and Navy. A concluding chapter treats military politics since 1962. São Paulo in the Brazilian Federation, 1889–1937

Joseph L. Love. This is the third of three independent but coordinated studies on Brazilian regionalism from the beginning of the Republic to the establishment of Getulio Vargas's Estado Novo in 1937. The first volume on Minas Gerais by John D. Wirth was published in 1977; the second volume, on Pernambuco by Robert M. Levine, was published in 1978. São Paulo's story is one of rapid economic expansion, first in agriculture and then in manufacturing. Its political elites—relying on massive exports and foreign borrowing—pioneered in state intervention in society and the economy, and in the process confused the interests of São Paulo with their own.
