This new book is an attempt to convey a feeling for the growth of surgery by presenting its leading personalities from the beginning of literary records to the present time. In quoting from their original writings, particular effort has been made to retain the *flavour* of their original style. Much of the charm lies therein, although this may entail sacrifice of some ease in reading. Original texts, in English or contemporary translations, have been used where possible. Many illustrations convey the drama and background of contemporary surgery.
