ASTRI SUHRKE is Assistant Professor of International Relations at the School of International Relations at the School of International Service of the American University. JOHN WATERBURY currently is Associate for the Middle East, American Universities Field Staff, resident in Cairo. MELVIN SMALL is Associate Professor of History at Wayne State University, and Visiting Lecturer at Aarhus University, Denmark. He is editor of *Public Opinion and Historians* (1970), and co-author of *The Wages of War 1816-1965, A Statistical Handbook* (1972). He is currently studying America's international wars.

J. DAVID SINGER is Professor of Political Science at the University of Michigan, a member of its Mental Health Research Institute, and President of the Peace Research Society for 1972-73. Among his works are *Financing International Organization; Deterrence, Arms Control, and Disarmament; Human Behavior and International Politics; The Wages of War; and Beyond Conjecture in International Politics*.

GERALD A. HEEGER is Assistant Professor at the Woodrow Wilson Department of Government and Foreign Affairs of the University of Virginia. He is the author of *Muddling Through: The Politics of Underdevelopment* (forthcoming).
