THE objects of the Society are to further the study of the history of science, by holding meetings for the reading and discussion of papers, and by facilitating the publication of relevant material.

The British Journal for the History of Science is the official organ of the Society.

Meetings are held in the Science Museum, Exhibition Road, South Kensington, London, S.W.7, usually in January, February, March, May, June, October and November.

Membership is open to all persons approved by the Council of the Society, and elected at an Ordinary Meeting. The annual subscription is at present £2 10s. and includes a free issue of the Society's Journal, which appears in June and December each year.

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The British Journal for the History of Science is published by the Society. Four parts constitute one Volume; each part contains approximately 96 pages. The cover of each issue has a consecutive number for ease of collation in subsequent binding, e.g. No. 16 will be numbered: Vol. IV Part IV No. 16, and No. 17 will be: Vol. V Part 1 No. 17.
