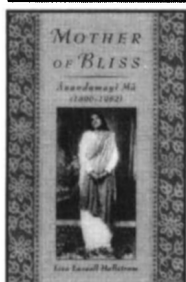

This book focuses upon the controversial character and activities of Hung Ch'eng-ch'ou, who first won distinction for his role in suppressing indigenous peasant armies in northwestern China. After being given command of the vital northeastern frontier military district, Hung was captured by the Manchu—and eventually joined his captors to assist them in conquering China and establishing the new Ch'ing dynasty. Although Hung has traditionally symbolized treachery and disloyalty, this book adopts a quite different focus. It brings mid-seventeenth century China to life in new ways, deepening our sense of the historical complexity of the era.

In 1994, Callaway conducted extensive research in Nanjing, China, by interviewing the parents of 26 deaf children. She also analyzed a large collection of letters written by other parents to the supervisor of the nursery school for deaf children that was the center of her research. Callaway then enhanced her interpretations of her 133-question interview with a balanced assessment of Chinese cultural influences, such as the government's one-child policy. The inclusion of data from a survey of 122 English mothers of deaf children reveals the differences between Western and Chinese parents and shows that many issues cross cultures and contexts. Her pioneering work will fascinate and enlighten readers for years to come.

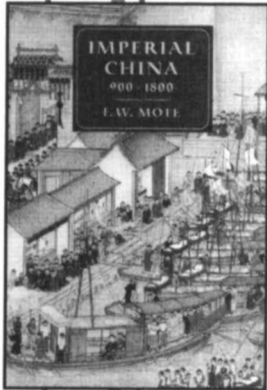

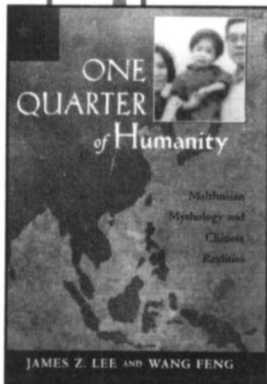

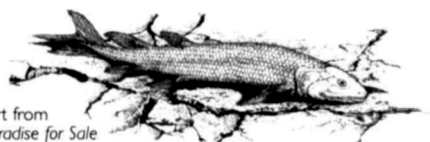
