*An Anthology of Essays*, by **BENEDETTO CROCE**, translated and edited by **CECIL SPRIGGE**. Mr. Sprigge, journalist, biographer, historian and personal friend of Croce, spent the last years before his own death in 1959 translating the main part of what is known in Italy as 'Croce in one volume' (published by Ricciardi, Milan, 1951). This translation contains eighty-four essays showing Croce in most of his different aspects, as philosopher, historian, politician, student, and critic in every field of life, sometimes deeply philosophical in his writing, sometimes relatively light, always lucid and dynamic. Cecil Sprigge's Introduction, *Benedetto Croce, Man and Thinker*, was first published in *Studies in Modern European Literature*. (\$15.75)

## CONTEMPORARY FRENCH POLITICAL THOUGHT

---

by **ROY PIERCE**. Post-war French political thought has been dominated by the writings of six people: Emmanuel Mounier, who sought the proper political role for the Christian; Simone Weil, a utopian anti-ideologist, who produced an alternative to Marxist determinism; Albert Camus, who sought to limit political violence; Jean-Paul Sartre, who combines existentialism and Marxism; Bertrand de Jouvenel, who speculates on how the common good can be attained; Raymond Aron, who considers how men can choose reasonably between conflicting regimes and ideologies. In this book Professor Pierce examines and compares their political ideas, showing what is distinctive about them, what they have in common, and how they differ from the doctrines which prevailed in France on the eve of the 1930s, which were this generation's formative years.
