

GREECE & ROME EDITORIAL POLICY

The editors wish to outline the current policy endorsed by the journal's Board of Management, in the hope that they may attract appropriate contributions from a wider range of contributors:

The journal publishes notes and articles on major authors and topics, not on the excessively technical or exotic;

the journal includes both literary studies and discussions of historical, religious, philosophical, archaeological, and artistic issues;

contributions of some 5–6,000 words or less are preferred; lectures, suitably modified (and abbreviated), can provide promising material for publication;

the editors are keen to report fresh approaches or new discoveries;

illustrated articles are particularly welcome;

it is hoped to revive the series of literary appreciation exercises.

The editors recognize their responsibilities towards non-linguistic students of classical antiquity as well as towards those specializing in the Greek and Latin languages, and welcome contributions designed to meet the needs of non-linguistic students.

The attention of contributors is directed to the notes on presentation which appear on the inside back cover of the journal.
