THE CONTRIBUTORS

MARSHALL D. SHULMAN is Associate Director of the Russian Research Center and Lecturer in Government at Harvard University. He formerly served as Special Assistant to the Secretary of State.

ARTHUR LEE BURNS is a Fellow of the Department of International Relations in the Australian National University at Canberra, A.C.T. His current subjects of research include the general theory of international relations, the relations between ideological movements and military alliances, and disarmament.

CHARLES A. MICAUD, Associate Professor in the Woodrow Wilson Department of Foreign Affairs at the University of Virginia, is writing a book on the French Left and communism which will be published in 1959.

EUGEN WEBER, Assistant Professor of History at the University of California (Los Angeles), is the editor of a book of readings, *The Western Tradition* (1956), and author of *The Nationalist Revival in France, 1905-1914*, to be published later this year. At present he is engaged in a study of the extreme Right in France since 1918.

WILLIAM W. KAUFMANN, a member of the Social Science Division of The RAND Corporation, is co-author of *Military Policy and National Security* (1956). He was formerly managing editor of *World Politics*.

GEORGE B. BALDWIN, Visiting Associate Professor in the Department of Economics at Vanderbilt University, has been Director of the Graduate Program in Economic Development during the past academic year. In August he leaves for Iran to serve as an economic advisor to the Plan Organization as a member of Harvard's Iran Advisory Project. His publications include *Beyond Nationalization: The Labor Problems of British Coal* (1955) and *Industrial Growth in South India: Case Studies in Economic Development*, which will appear this fall.

ERNST B. HAAS, Assistant Professor of Political Science at the University of California (Berkeley), is engaged in continuing studies of regional integration in Europe under a grant from the Rockefeller Foundation. He is the author of *Dynamics of International Relations* (with Allen S. Whiting, 1956) and *The Uniting of Europe* (1958).

MORROE BERGER is Associate Professor of Sociology and a member of the faculty of the Program in Near Eastern Studies at Princeton University. His most recent publication is *Bureaucracy and Society in Modern Egypt* (1957).

Robert W. Tucker, Associate Professor of Political Science at the Johns Hopkins University, served as consultant to the Naval War College from 1954 to 1957. He recently published a volume entitled *Law of War and Neutrality at Sea* (1957), written under the auspices of the War College.
