## **LATE HELLADIC CITADELS ON MAINLAND GREECE**

by

Spyros E. Iakovidis

This book deals with one of the most characteristic features of Mycenaean culture, the fortified seats of authority of the Achaean heads of state, as distinct from the walled settlements and from the few unfortified palaces of the time. Based on the present state of knowledge, it gives a detailed description of the fortifications and the buildings discovered at Tiryns, Midea, Mycenae, Athens and Gla, of which sites the last three are the author's particular field of research. The approach to the subject is mainly descriptive, focussing on the architectural layout of the citadels and following its development, but it becomes soon apparent that their building history represents more than a structural evolution and that in fact it mirrors the rise, the peak and the decline of the Achaean world more closely than any other feature of the civilization which created them.
