Our annual conference in Exeter on July 23-25 promises to be a stimulating occasion, and 3 workshops will take place on the two preceding days. They are: Personal effectiveness training by Bob Liberman, Marital and sexual problems, by Mike Crowe and Patricia Gillan, and Behavioural programmes with adolescents, by Gene Moss. So two-thirds of the workshops will be run by Californians. Two further workshops are planned later in the year, both at the Maudsley Hospital. On Saturday, Nov. 6 a workshop on 'Behavioural approaches to the addictions' will be run by Drs. Ray Hodgson, Howard Rankin and Martin Raw. On Nov. 26-27 Dr. Julian Bird and nurse-therapists will run a 2-day workshop concerning treatment of adult neurosis. Next year we hope there may be a combined annual meeting between the American ABT and the BABP. Both Executives are keen to have this and the possibilities are currently being explored. If 1977 turns out to be awkward, then there might be a combined American and European meeting in 1978 instead.

We have had enquiries concerning professional insurance for those who practice behavioural psychotherapy on a private basis, and are exploring what can be done in this regard.

There is much happening in the behavioural field, which seems to be expanding steadily, especially from the grass roots level up, which is a healthy state of affairs. We would welcome as much news as possible from the Branches for publication in the Bulletin so we can all learn what's cooking and what's news.
