This book has been written at the suggestion of the National Federation of Young Farmers' Clubs, who feel that it is greatly needed at the present time to link the science and practice of animal breeding.

The first part of the book is on genetics and deals only with those principles which have a direct practical application to farm animals. In the section on Breeding for Special Purposes an attempt has been made to describe some of the particular characters for which selection is being made and methods involved in doing this.

Sir John Hammond is already very well known to students of agriculture for his book *Farm Animals*, and his new book is assured of equal success with those who require a less full treatment of the subject.
