A Colloquium, entitled 'Bentham et l'utilitarisme, hier et aujourd'hui' and sponsored by the faculties of Letters and Law of the University of Geneva, was held in Geneva on 23–4 November 1990. The following papers were presented: Cyprian Blamires (UCL), 'Jeremy Bentham et Etienne Dumont'; Marco Guidi (Teramo), 'La reception de l'oeuvre de Bentham au XIXe siècle'; William Thomas (Oxford), 'English Utilitarianism and Liberalism in the Early 19th Century'; Fred Rosen (UCL), 'Bentham and Negative Liberty'; Jacques Bouveresse (Sorbonne and Geneva), 'La théorie des fictions chez Bentham'; Michel van de Kerchove (St. Louis, Brussels), 'Le système des preuves en droit chez Bentham'; John Skorupski (St. Andrews), 'Value and Distribution'; and Alain Caille (Caen), 'Utilitarisme scientifique et utilitarisme philosophique'.
