



# ANTIQUITY

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*Cover. Mad Dog Tower in Sand Canyon, a Pueblo III period (thirteenth century AD) site located in the central Mesa Verde region in south-western Colorado (USA) during the initial documentation and preparation for laser scanning and photogrammetry research by a Polish team. The maximum height of the tower is now 3.2m above the modern ground surface (and was probably 4.5m). It may have been a part of a communication/signalling system within a larger community of allied sites (the so-called Castle Rock Community) (photograph by R. Staboński).
