# Unperfected Treaties of the United States of America

**T**reaties reflect a nation's international relations and its position on questions of international law. Unperfected treaties, although not entered into force, having been signed or submitted to the Senate also reflect these qualities. As such, the historical importance of unperfected treaties and their interrelation with some perfected ones warrants access to these often unready available texts.

Oceana's *Unperfected Treaties of the United States of America* provides such access.

This unique series offers chronological access by date of signature to the 433 unperfected treaties of the United States of America from 1776-1976.

Each of the 9 volumes contains a list of unperfected treaties, sources cited, complete texts (original printed texts when available), and a short index.

The concluding volume also contains a **cumulative index**, which includes such appendices as a list of the Unperfected Treaty Series, lists of treaties not included in this series, and a list of pending treaties.
