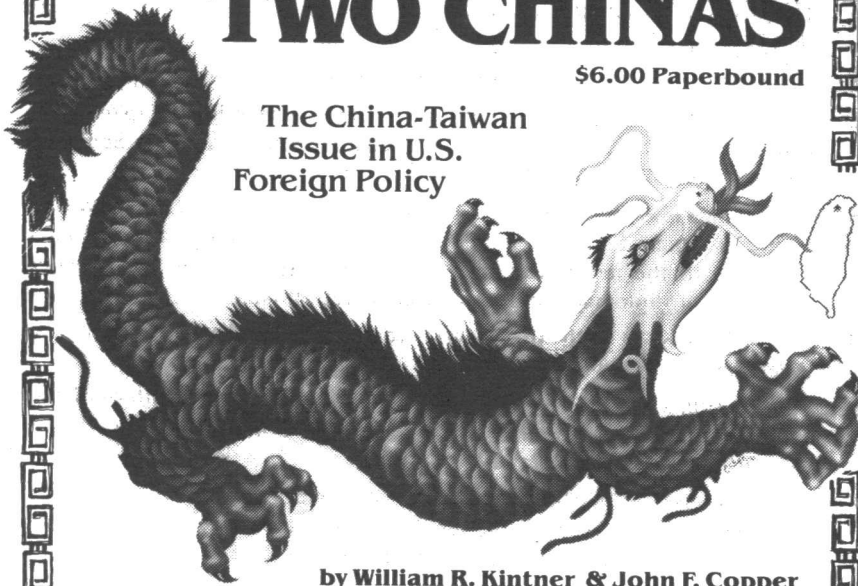

On December 15, 1978, President Carter announced a new policy: diplomatic recognition of the People's Republic of China and de-recognition of the Republic of China. By linking recognition with America's abrogation of the U.S.-Taiwan defense treaty, the authors argue, the United States committed a serious error, violating the first rule of diplomacy—don't give something away without getting something in return. In this deft analysis of America's China policy, Professors Kintner and Copper discuss the political and moral implications of the new policy and show how the United States can still salvage some credibility and reassure its allies.
