HUME'S PHILOSOPHICAL DEVELOPMENT:

A Study of His Methods, by JAMES NOXON, *McMaster University*. Hume's Treatise has as its inspiration Sir Isaac Newton's *Philosophiae Naturalis Principia Mathematica*. After examining the Newtonian method, Professor Noxon discusses Hume's unsuccessful attempt to adapt the experimental method of the physical sciences to the investigation of the philosophical problems. He then traces the development of Hume's thinking about the limits of knowledge and rational belief. He argues that Hume's sceptical critique of metaphysics and theology depends not upon psychological theory but upon a legitimate demand for methodological consistency and shows how Hume later discarded empirical psychology and turned to the study of history for his understanding of human nature. \$8.85
