Members and friends who would like to come are asked to write to the Secretary, FPS, so that we know how many to expect. A route map, showing how to get to the Wildlife Reserve, will be sent. The party will meet at 12 noon at the Reserve. Please bring a sandwich lunch. Coffee will be provided.

THE FILM LIBRARY

The latest addition to the FPS Film Library is an outstandingly good life story of the swallowtail butterfly in colour. For this there will be a hire charge of £2. All other films in the library are still loaned free to members and others, apart from the handling charge of £1, but in order to pay for good new films such as this one, and improve the library stock, there will in future be a hire charge on films bought for (but not on those presented to) the library, starting with *The Swallowtail*. Members will find an additional source of wildlife films in the World Wildlife Fund library, which the Fund has generously made available. These are listed on page 272.
