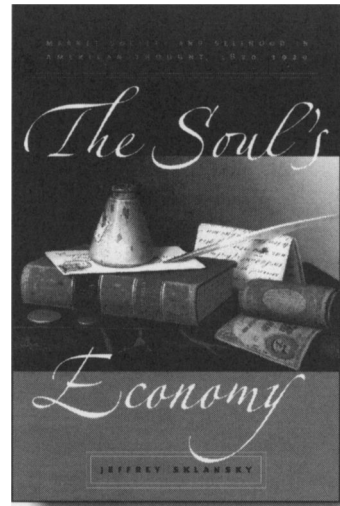
NANCY COHEN
