## **POLITICAL CHANGE IN UNDERDEVELOPED COUNTRIES**

### **Nationalism and Communism**

*Edited with an original essay*

by JOHN H. KAUTSKY, *Washington University.*

This book was conceived to answer the need for a general introduction to the politics of underdeveloped countries. It consists of an extended essay by the editor, a political scientist, and twelve articles by contributors from several of the social sciences. In his essay, Professor Kautsky analyzes the roles of various groups in politics, particularly the intellectuals, and formulates a number of broad generalizations concerning the political effects of industrialization on underdeveloped countries. He explores the nature of and relationship between nationalism and Communism in this light, and projects the possible trends toward totalitarianism and democracy. Communism, from Lenin to the present, is treated not as an outside force acting on underdeveloped countries but as an aspect of their political development.

The twelve articles enlarge upon and reinforce various points raised by the essay. They are analytical rather than descriptive in nature and, while some deal with specific geographical areas, all make a contribution to a theory of the politics of underdevelopment. Reproduced uncut and unchanged from their original sources, the articles combine with the essay to provide the reader with a highly unified presentation of the subject. 1962. 347 pages. Applications are invited for a number of appointments between the grades of Senior Fellow and Research Fellow in the Department of International Relations of the Research School of Pacific Studies.

Members of the Department conduct research and supervise graduate work in the international politics of Asia and the Pacific and on theoretical problems of International Relations.

Applicants should have academic qualifications, and/or experience of research, in International Relations. Other things being equal, preference will be given to applicants in one or more of the following fields: Chinese foreign policy; Malaysia, Indonesia or the Philippines, the Thailand-Indochinese area; defence policy; foreign aid; International Institutions; theory and methodology of International Relations.

The salaries and ranges of Senior Fellows and Fellows are determined within the limits of £A3,000-3,550 and £A2,120-3,000 per annum respectively. Appointment to age 65, with the option of retirement after age 60, is normally confirmed before expiry of the initial appointment which is for five years. Senior Fellows and Fellows are entitled to one year's study leave on full pay, plus a contribution towards travel and other expenses, in every six and seven years, respectively.

The salary ranges for Senior Research Fellows and Research Fellows are £A2,620-3,160 and £A1,625-2,450 per annum respectively. Appointment is made within one of these ranges, according to qualifications, for a period of three years, with possible extension to the maximum of five years.

Superannuation is on the F.S.S.U. pattern. Reasonable travel expenses are paid and assistance with housing is provided.
