ALBION is published quarterly, April, July, October, January. Manuscripts and editorial correspondence are to be sent to the editor. Submission of manuscripts by disk, using MS/DOS or Mackintosh, must be accompanied by two letter quality hard copies. Please specify what operating system and wordprocessor has been used. We prefer that authors NOT use the special footnoting functions of their wordprocessors; instead notes should be merely appended to the main text. In the absence of disks two double-spaced copies of the manuscript are required. Manuscripts should conform to the *Chicago Manual of Style*, especially in footnote form. Manuscripts should not exceed 10,000 words and for their return be accompanied by postage.

BOOK REVIEWS evaluate the scholarship of books and evaluate their contribution to the field and relevance to other literature. *Albion* does not accept unsolicited book reviews, and does not underwrite the opinions of its reviewers. Persons interested in writing reviews should send a Vita to the editor. Proposals for review essays concerning the historiography of a field, era, or important theme in British history are encouraged. They should be communicated to the editor.
