Reptile Keeper's Handbook

This is a comprehensive practical guide to reptile keeping. There are brief notes on nomenclature, taxonomy, anatomy and physiology. Other chapters include: selecting, handling, transporting, housing, feeding and nutritional disorders, hygiene, health, medical and necropsy considerations, reproduction and egg incubation.

The Appendices consist of some 100 pages and include valuable information on the climates, habits, habitats and food preferences of all reptilian genera; maintenance of selected insect colonies (for food), composition of various foods, harmful plants, therapeutics and products available. For all reptile enthusiasts, amateur or professional.

Managing Vertebrate Pests: Feral Goats

A comprehensive review of feral goats in Australia, including their history, distribution, biology, impact and use. Community attitudes to management are examined, and past and current management practices discussed. The authors set out strategies for control and point out deficiencies in knowledge and practice. Essential reading for policymakers, farmers and conservation reserve managers.

Agricide: The Hidden Farm and Food Crisis That Affects Us All, 2nd Edition
