INFORMATION FOR AUTHORS

Essays offered for publication should be addressed to The Editor, International Council for Traditional Music, Department of Music, Columbia University, New York, NY 10027.

Books, periodicals, and other printed materials for review should be sent directly to the Book Review editor, Professor Beverley Cavanagh, Music Department, Queen's University, Kingston, Ontario, Canada K7L 3N6; recordings to the Record Review editor, Professor Claudie Marcel-Dubois, Musée National des Arts et Traditions Populaires, 6, rue du Mahatma Gandhi, 75116 Paris, France.

Please send two copies of your manuscript. Manuscripts must be typed on one side of the sheet only, double spaced, with ample margins, including bibliography, footnotes, and long quotations. Please number footnotes consecutively throughout the article and type on a separate sheet. Music examples should be copied one after another, using ample spacing, on a separate sheet of music manuscript paper with notation made as to their location in the main body of the paper. Song texts should be typed, with appropriate hyphens, on a separate sheet. Authors may submit manuscripts in English, French or German (with an English summary). All manuscripts must be accompanied by an abstract of 50 to 100 words and brief biographical data on the author.

Authors are also requested to supply, whenever appropriate and possible, a one-page summary of their article in the language of the subject matter, to be printed with their contribution. A manuscript dealing with Japanese matsuri bayashi, for instance, should be accompanied by a one-page summary in Japanese, camera-ready for offset reproduction.

N.B.—Members of the ICTM receive the *Yearbook* in addition to the Council's *Bulletin* (each April and October) and other occasional publications. The Council's annual publications began with the *Journal of the International Folk Music Council* (Vols. 1-20, 1949-1968), which was followed by the *Yearbook of the International Folk Music Council* (Vols. 1-12, 1969-1980), now appearing as the *Yearbook for Traditional Music* (Vol. 13-, 1981).
