At times when the State was particularly active in its opposition to the Church in Russia during collectivization and the great purges, members of the Orthodox Church formed illegal Church groups and carried on their worship in secret. Even when the Orthodox Church came to accept the political regime, opposition movements formed round the clergy who refused to compromise with the State.

Despite the importance of Athanasius's *Contra Gentes—De Incarnatione* no critical edition has previously been published. One of its most interesting features is that two recensions are known. The three books *Ad Autolyicum* by Theophilus, Bishop of Antioch late in the second century, set forth a unique Christian apologetic approach to Graeco-Roman culture, and tell a good deal about the Christian community itself, with its emphasis on faith and revelation and the doctrines related to creation, history, and future resurrection and judgement. £2
