In this paper Veleviski *et al.* quantified population trends in three countries (Bulgaria, Greece and the Yugoslav Republic [FYR] of Macedonia) and report a rapid and consistent decline that was largely similar among the three countries. As a consequence, the breeding range of Egyptian Vultures has contracted and the population in the Balkan Peninsula has fragmented into six subpopulations separated by more than 80 km.
