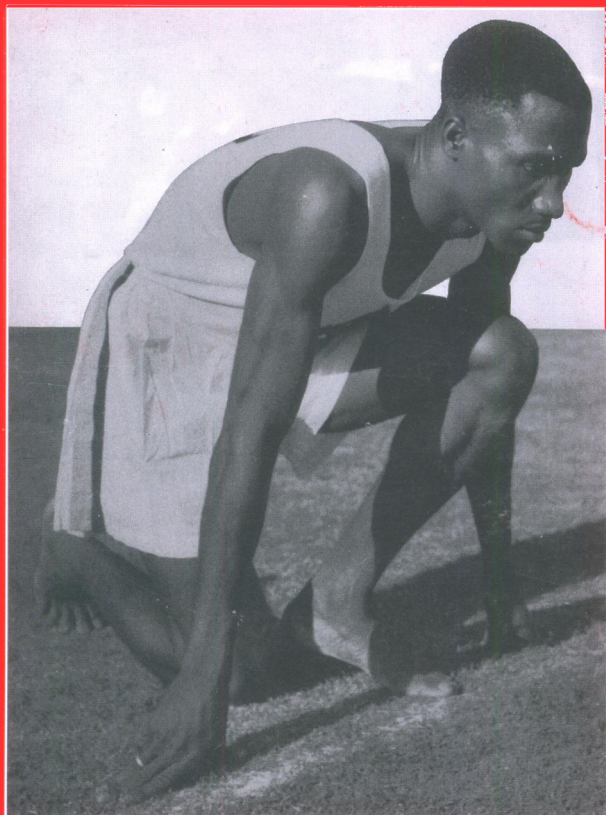
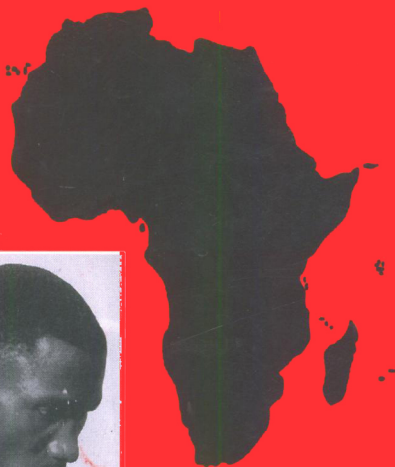

E.H. Duckworth was Inspector of Education in Nigeria 1930- 1953, and a photographer and editor for *The Nigeria Magazine*. His archive of more than 5,000 photographs document Nigerian life in the decades leading up to independence. We have unfortunately been unable to identify the runner depicted in this photograph.
