The Anglican Response to Newman

B. A. SMITH (*Rector of Holy Trinity, Micklegate, York*)

An undergraduate in 1833, and Fellow of Oriel, 1838-52, R. W. Church saw the rise of the Oxford Movement and took a significant part in the affairs of that time especially after Newman's conversion in 1845. He helped to found the *Guardian*, was a friend and confidant of Gladstone, and as Dean of St. Paul's (1871-90) prepared the way for the future development of Anglicanism. This is the only Life to be published since 1894 and the author's wholehearted interest in Church and his skilful use of the sources, some unpublished, make an attractive presentation of an important figure in Anglicanism.
