MALCOLM JAMES ROWLEY DUNSTAN, O.B.E., M.A., late Professor of Agriculture, University of Bristol, was born on August 19, 1863, and educated at Bedford Grammar School, St Paul's School, and Merton College, Oxford. He was Director of the Midland Agricultural and Dairy Institute (1896–1902); Director of Technical Instruction, Notts County Council (1891–1902); Principal of the South-Eastern Agricultural College, Wye, Kent (1902–1922); and Principal of the Royal Agricultural College, Cirencester (1922–1927).

He was elected a Fellow of this Society in 1892 and died on May 28, 1938.

ROBERT BLACK THOMSON, M.B., Ch.B. (Edin.), formerly Professor of Anatomy, University of Cape Town, was elected a Fellow of this Society in 1912, and contributed a valuable paper to its *Transactions* (1909) on "The Osteology of Antarctic Seals (Scottish National Antarctic Expedition, 1902–1904)."

He died on December 17, 1937, at Aliwal North, Cape Province.
