

NOTICE TO CONTRIBUTORS

All editorial communications should be addressed to the Secretary, Royal Asiatic Society, 56 Queen Anne Street, London W1M 9LA, in the first instance.

Contributions submitted for publication in the Society's *Journal* should be typed in double spacing on quarto paper, leaving a margin of at least 16 strokes at the left-hand side. Sheets should be numbered consecutively at the top right-hand corner. Notes, numbered consecutively through the article, should be typed on a separate sheet or sheets at the end and not at the foot of each sheet.

Authors are urged to study the conventions employed in recent issues of the *Journal*, particularly the style of citation of books and periodical articles, and the bibliographical information inserted at the head of reviews. Contributions should be submitted in a form ready for the printer; later corrections which would involve over-running can be accepted only at the Editor's discretion. Galleys will be sent to authors, but not page proofs.

Authors of articles will be supplied with 25 free copies of offprints. Additional copies can be obtained on request at moderate charges; authors are asked to notify the Editor of their requirements when returning proofs.

MEMBERSHIP AND SUBSCRIPTION

1. Any person desirous of becoming a Fellow must be nominated by one Fellow and seconded by another, of whom one must act on a personal knowledge that the candidate is likely to be a suitable and useful Fellow ; and the nominating Fellows shall address the Secretary in writing and give the candidate's name, address, and occupation, or status, and shall state to which class the candidate desires to be admitted. Provided always that for persons domiciled abroad it shall be within the power of the Council, on being satisfied as to the credentials of any particular candidate, to dispense with these conditions.

FROM BIBLE TO MISHNA THE CONTINUITY OF TRADITION

J. Weingreen A compendium of Jewish law, the Mishna has at its core the written law of the Old Testament, adapted and amplified over the centuries. Professor Weingreen shows us that this process was at work much earlier than supposed and claiming that rabbinical modes of interpretation can be found in the Old Testament provides a reappraisal of Deuteronomy as a proto-Mishna. This leads to a reassessment of the study of the Pentateuch and an examination of such subjects as the 'Dead Sea Scrolls' community and the origin of the synagogue. The book is intended for the student as well as the theologian, and can be followed without knowledge of Hebrew. £7.50 net

MITHRAIC STUDIES edited by **John R. Hinnells** This two-volume work is based on the papers presented at the first International Congress of Mithraic Studies held at Manchester University in 1971. Until then, the study of this religion, mention of which dates from the 14th century BC and which extended from Britain in the west to India and Iran in the east, was dominated by Franz Cumont. Now fundamental reassessments of his interpretations are offered, although many earlier positions are stated and the book includes the last article ever written by Cumont, previously unpublished, on the Dura Europos Mithraeum. There are 120 illustrations, including a number of colour plates. £25.00 net

PEOPLE OF SALÉ TRADITION AND CHANGE IN A MOROCCAN CITY 1830–1930 **Kenneth L. Brown** A study of social change in a Muslim, pre-industrial city during the era of colonialism and early nationalism. Based on original sources and extensive fieldwork it shows the effect of expansion, imperialism and the first decades of colonial rule on the social and economic life of an urban community. Dr Brown describes the spatial organisation of the city and its relations with the countryside, and shows how the traditional ideas were largely maintained, the community bound together by a common culture and social ties. £9.95 net

TIME AND THE CALENDARS **W. J. O'Neil** Time, conceptually at least, flows on continuously and uniformly and yet man, at first for practical reasons but later for intellectual ones, has constructed countless calendars and time-measures to mark off its passage. Professor O'Neil presents an account of the major calendars—Egyptian, Roman, Mesopotamian, etc.—as well as tracing the origins of our own Gregorian calendar. £4.50 net

MONUMENTA NIPPONICA was founded in 1938 with the aim of publishing scholarly contributions on different aspects of Japanese culture—literature, history, religion and art. The journal is now in its thirty-first volume and appears four times a year with its text entirely in English.

RECENT issues have included articles on *Nise Monogatari*, an irreverent 17th-century parody of *Ise Monogatari*; Saikaku's last short stories; the house regulations of Hōjō Sōun, 1432–1519; the *Kenreimon'in Ukyō no Daibu Shū*; the Soejima mission to China, 1873; a case study of Fukui local politics in the 1880s; Ōgai's short story *Maibime*; and Chu Shun-shui, the Ming refugee scholar.

LATER this year *MN* will publish a study of the playwright Tanaka Chikao; stories from the *Hasedera Kannon Genki*; the testimony of Yamaga Sokō, 1622–1685; and Robert H. Brower's translation of Fujiwara Teika's *Shōji Hyakushū* poems, 1200; and also various other features, translations, and book reviews.

Articles in languages other than English must be accompanied by an abstract in English. Manuscripts not in Chinese must be typed in double spacing on single sides of quarto paper, and should be accompanied by a brief biographical note about the author. Footnotes should appear at the end of typescript articles. Contributors receive 25 offprints of their articles.

The annual subscription to the *Journal* is HK\$60. Single issues are sold for HK\$30. Subscriptions and business correspondence should be addressed to the Hong Kong University Press, University of Hong Kong, Hong Kong.
