Neither Marxist hypotheses nor traditional theories of urbanization adequately describe the struggle: the urban establishment trying to incorporate workers into an existing hierarchy and regulate all aspects of their lives, the migrant workers taking paths of resistance ranging from political action, strikes, and squatter towns to underground economies. In this volume of original essays, edited by Herskovitz Award winner Frederick Cooper, authors explore the tumult underlying African urban development . . . and its implications for today.

As U.S. attention to Caribbean affairs has mounted, Cuba's domestic policies and foreign policy behavior have emerged as key focal points of debate. In this volume, five distinguished scholars address the paradoxes that have made Cuba internationally feared, admired, attacked, and defended—to an extent far out of proportion to its power in world affairs.

Dominguez opens with a lucid survey of contemporary Cuban history, society, and politics, casting new light on the evolution of Castro's revolutionary regime. Other contributors examine such domestic issues as the foreseeable results of the current five-year plan, and the relative effects of different social, technological, and ideological constraints on the mass media. In the foreign policy arena, the prospects for further Cuban activism in the Third World are explored, along with potential American strategies for changing Cuba's foreign policies and behavior. As an authoritative overview of Cuba's domestic challenges and role in international affairs, this collection represents the definitive guide to contemporary Cuba.
