I would like to add a footnote to the commentary regarding the death of Waldemar A. Solf (82 AJIL 562 (1988)). When I was in the ABA House of Delegates as a representative of the Section of International Law and Practice, I called on Solf to solicit his advice in obtaining letters from the Judge Advocates of the U.S. Army, Navy and Air Force and the General Counsel of the Department of Defense in support of the passage of the international Convention against Genocide. The Convention was to be presented to the ABA House of Delegates for the third time. These letters played a vital part in the passage of the Convention by voice vote. We should remember Solf not only as a legal scholar but also for his support of human rights.
