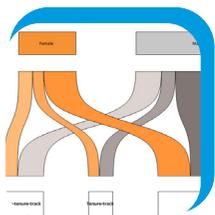
## Datasets

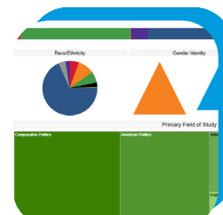
The P-WAM Dashboard outlines the breakdown of gender and race/ethnicity in political science departments at the 21 largest PhD-granting institutions.



The MENA Workshops Alumni Dashboard provides a look at the alumni of APSA’s MENA Workshops, including their fields of study and organized section memberships.
