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

## Special Issue: The United States and World Order



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The Journal of American Studies publishes work by scholars of any nationality on American literature, history, art, music, institutions, politics, economics, geography and related subjects. Articles which cross conventional borders between academic disciplines are particularly welcome, as are comparative studies of American and other cultures. It also publishes notes and comments, state-of-the-art essays, review essays, book reviews, and biennially, a list of theses on American topics in progress and completed at British universities.

Contributors need not be members of the British Association for American Studies. Decisions on articles submitted are normally made within three months and those accepted published within a year. Details about the submission of manuscripts are given at the end.

The British Association for American Studies was founded in 1955 to promote the study of the United States within the United Kingdom. It welcomes applications for membership from people interested in the history, society, government and politics, economics, geography, art, popular culture, literature and thought of the United States.
