The principal aim of this book is to address the international legal questions arising from the 'right of visit on the high seas' in the 21st century. This right is considered the most

## The Proposed Nordic Saami Convention

In 2005 an expert group representing the governments of Norway, Sweden and Finland, and the Saami parliaments of these countries agreed upon a draft text of a Nordic Saami Convention. Key parts of the text deal with the recognition of Saami land and resource rights. More recently the three governments have embarked on negotiations to move from this draft text to a final convention that may be adopted and ratified by all three countries. This collection of essays explores the national and international dimensions of the draft Convention which recognises the Saami as one people divided by international boundaries.
