Burden Research Medal and Prize

Entry for the Burden Medal and Prize is open to all registered medical practitioners who are working in the field of mental handicap in the United Kingdom or Republic of Ireland.

The award for 1984, consisting of a gold medal and prize of £500, may be presented for outstanding research work which has been published, accepted for publication or presented as a paper to a learned society during the three-year period ending 31 December 1983. Five copies of the paper or papers, with application form, should be submitted to the Secretary of the Burden Trust by 10 January 1984. Tuke House—a Community Mental Health Centre

Tuke House, a Community Mental Health Centre for the treatment of neurotic disorders, was officially opened by Professor Michael Barrett (Chairman of the Leeds Eastern Health Authority) on 13 September 1983. This unique treatment facility is sited in a large old house in Chapeltown,

Leeds, two miles distant from the local psychiatric facilities. Its inauguration has resulted from co-operation between Leeds Eastern Health Authority, Social Services Department, Community Health Council, voluntary agencies and the Department of Psychiatry, University of Leeds, with joint financing from Leeds Eastern Health Authority and Leeds City Council. The Royal College of Psychiatrists was represented at the opening by Dr K. Davison, Chairman of the North East Division.

Managing the Overdose Patient

Dr R. Gardner (Consultant Psychiatrist, Addenbrooke's Hospital, Cambridge) has compiled a booklet on the assessment and management of the overdose patient. This booklet is primarily aimed at doctors and nurses, without experience in psychiatry, who have to face a patient who has taken an overdose. Guidance is given on assessing the suicidal risk and the need for psychiatric or social work referral.
