The purpose of this book is to determine the relation of the "Apology" of Plato to the actual speech delivered by Socrates at his trial. The author's justification for it is the wide variation of opinion which at present prevails; e.g. Burnet and Professor A. E. Taylor incline to the view that Plato gives a true and faithful reproduction of Socrates' own speech. A contrary view is held by some of the continental scholars, and was put forward by Professor Bury in his Selected Essays, published in 1930.
