## Call for Papers: 'Meaning in Life'

Special Issue of *Philosophical Papers*

**Guest Editor:** Thaddeus Metz, University of the Witwatersrand (Johannesburg) and University of Missouri (St. Louis)

**Expected contributors** include Robert Audi, John Martin Fischer, Laurence Thomas, and J. David Velleman.

For most of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, the question of what, if anything, makes a life meaningful was unjustly neglected by analytic philosophers. However, as a result of the demise of positivism, the widespread acceptance of reflective equilibrium in normative thinking, and the contemporary interest in virtue, perfection, and *eudaemonia*, some analytic literature devoted to the question of life's meaning has emerged. While this literature has been revealing, it is comparatively small and amenable to substantial contributions.

Contributions are sought for an issue of *Philosophical Papers* devoted to several facets of the topic of life's meaning. These include, but are not restricted to, the following:

- What does "the meaning of life" mean? Are there different kinds of meaning that should be distinguished?
- What are the value-theoretic features of meaningfulness? For instance, is meaning always intrinsically valuable? Is it so valuable that it is always unreasonable to live a meaningless life?
- Must God exist for one's life to be meaningful? Is there any plausible God-centred alternative to the idea that we obtain meaning by playing a role in God's plan?
- Is immortality required for a meaningful life? Is death?
- In virtue of what are certain uncontroversially meaningful conditions meaningful? For example, why is a good marriage more meaningful than a series of good one-night stands? Why do certain kinds of knowledge confer meaning?
- What is the most defensible subjective, non-religious account of meaning in life? Which version of subjectivism most promises to avoid counterintuitive implications about which lives count as meaningful?
- Are there objective, non-religious ways to make one's life? If so, do they all have something in common? Do they presuppose moral realism?
- What is the strongest argument for nihilism, the view that life is meaningless? Is life necessarily meaningless from the objective standpoint?

The deadline for submissions is 30 June 2005. This issue of *Philosophical Papers*, comprising both invited and submitted articles, will appear in November of 2005.

Manuscripts should be submitted by post to *Philosophical Papers*, Department of Philosophy, Rhodes University, Grahamstown 6140, South Africa. Please include two hard copies along with an electronic Word-document version of the paper (either saved onto a new, clearly labeled 3.5-inch PC-formatted floppy disk, or emailed as an attachment).
