This is a spiritual classic from the pen of an Augustinian friar who was a renowned theologian at the University of Salamanca in the sixteenth century. As a lyric poet, he equals St John of the Cross; as a lover of nature, gifted with the ability to see God through visible creation, he is on a par with Ven. Louis of Granada.

Arranged in the form of a conversation among three friars, *The Names of Christ* provides an inspiring commentary on the various names which are applied to Christ in Sacred Scripture. Far from being a technical or purely exegetical treatise, the work abounds with inspiring and practical applications to the spiritual life. It is a work filled with humane sympathy, poetic charm, and devotion to Christ. 36s.
