Up to three James Bryant Conant Fellowships in German and European Studies will be awarded for 1996-1997 by the Program for the Study of Germany and Europe at the Minda de Gunzburg Center for European Studies, Harvard University. Applications are accepted from non-tenured persons who are teaching or planning to teach at the university level in North America. Projects should focus on contemporary German or German and European topics and should be located in the fields of history, politics. economics, society, or culture. The Fellowship offers \$32,000 over a twelve-month period, and is residential at the Center for European Studies. Contributory health insurance as well as a \$1,000 research travel fund is available. A publishable monograph is required upon completion. Applicants must be officially postdoctoral by July 1, 1996. Harvard and M.I.T. Ph.D.s should have taught or conducted research elsewhere for at least two years prior to application. Applications are due by January 19, 1996. Submit four copies plus the original of a five-page research project description, a three-page dissertation abstract, and a C.V. Two letters of recommendation are also required.

CONFLICTING VISIONS OF REFORM
German Lay Propaganda Pamphlets, 1519-1530
Miriam Usher Chrisman

How are ideas communicated when a new ideology appears? Professor Chrisman examines this question by analyzing 300 propaganda pamphlets written by German laymen and women at the onset of the Protestant Reformation. The traditional assumption is that Luther's message was accepted with little change. Yet the pamphlets reveal that each group in German society heard Luther's message differently. While some followed Luther's doctrines, others followed Zwingli's; still others picked different ideas from various reformers, and some even created their own theology. Many enthusiastically presented their own interpretations of the Gospels to support arguments for social change. Professor Chrisman's book is the first book to present a comprehensive selection that includes 119 lay writers: knights, technicians, lower rural civil servants, urban patricians, learned urban civil servants, and artisans.


