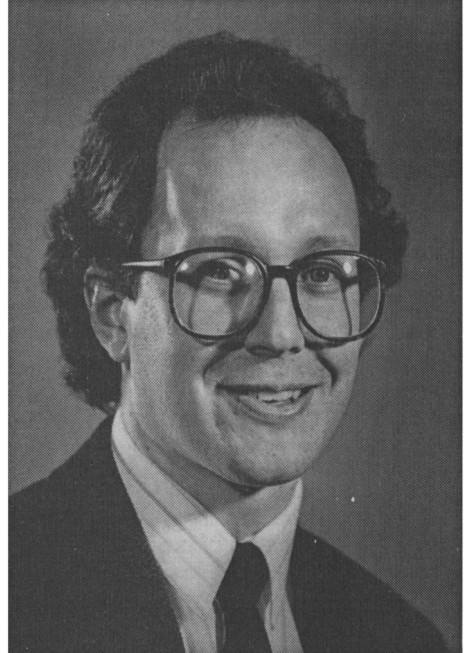
William D. Zaferos Named Poynter Fellow

William D. Zaferos, state and national political reporter for the Appleton, Wisconsin, *Post-Crescent*, has been named the 1987-88 Poynter Fellow in the Congressional Fellowship Program.

As a Congressional Fellow, Zaferos is serving as legislative aide to Norman Mineta (D-CA).

For the past five years The Poynter Fund has generously provided direct support for APSA journalism Fellows, and this is the third year the Fund has supported a named Poynter Fellow. The first was Celia Cohen, senior statehouse reporter for the *Wilmington News-Journal* newspapers.
