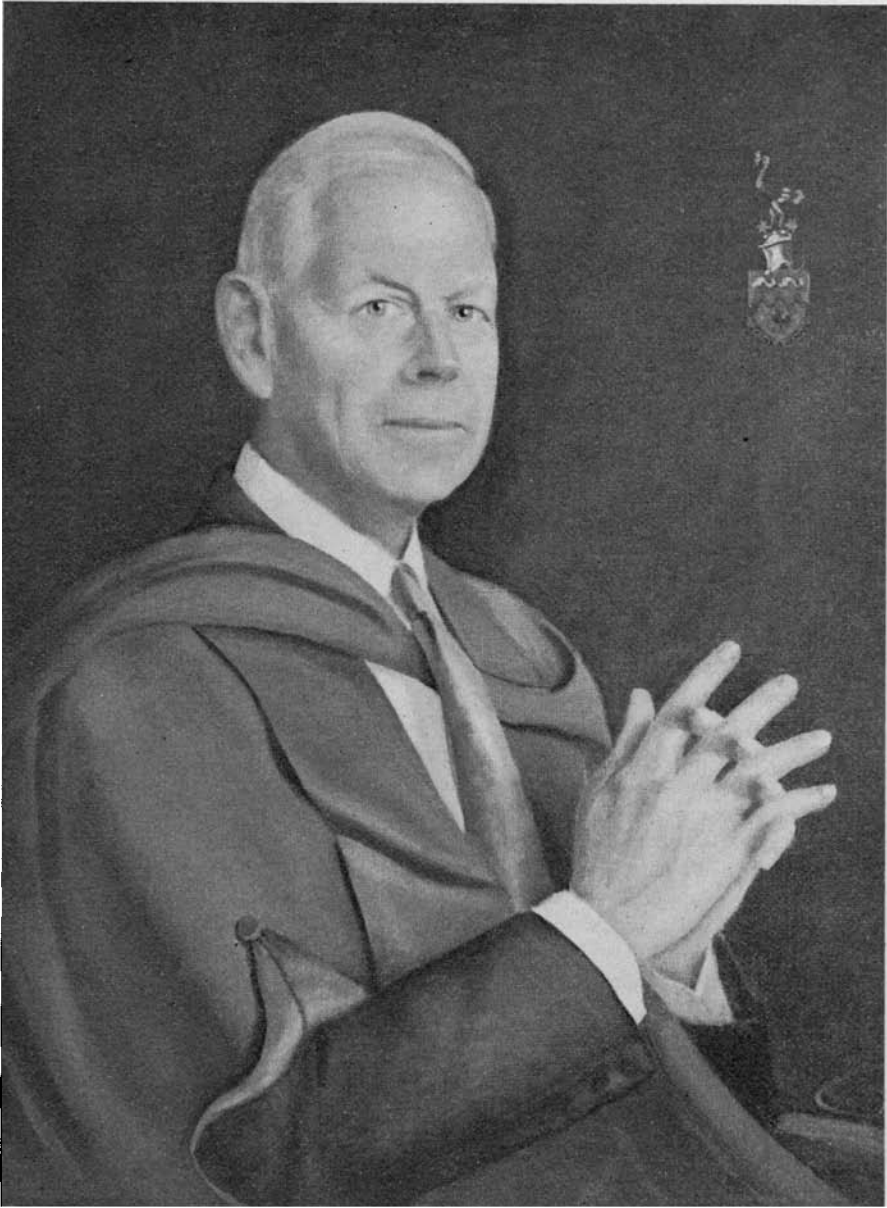

House, of Los Angeles, in recognition of his unique contribution to otolaryngology, after a citation of honour had been read. Dr. House made a speech of thanks.
