A new association of Bulgarian psychiatrists

In November 1991 an Initiative Committee was set up at the Sixth Congress of Bulgarian Psychiatrists in Sofia to prepare the ground for a new, independent professional organisation of Bulgarian psychiatrists. It was recognised that there was pressing need for a rapid change in the organisation and practice of psychiatry, on the build-up of a new professional identity and new professional organisations, and innovation in education and training. It was felt that the great majority of Bulgarian psychiatrists wished for a closer integration in, and intensive collaboration with, the world psychiatric community.
