# THE BRIDLINGTON DIALOGUE

Edited and Translated by a Religious of C.S.M.V.

*The Bridlington Dialogue*, here printed and translated for the first time, is a commentary on the Rule of St. Augustine, attributed on strong internal and circumstantial evidence to Robert the Scribe (obit 1167), the fourth prior of St. Mary's, Bridlington.

Two manuscripts only of the work are so far known, one in the Bodleian, the other in the College Library at Durham. Of these, the former is the older and longer, the latter an abridgement obviously made from a revised version of the original work.

The text here printed is, therefore, that of Durham, wherever possible, the Durham omissions only being supplied from the Bodleian text, and all variants noted in the apparatus criticus.

For the convenience of readers, the text, continuous in the manuscripts, is here divided into eighteen chapters. After the rather stilted though interesting prologue, most of which the Durham manuscript omits, the Commentary itself proves highly readable. The whole work is deeply spiritual and full of sturdy wisdom and holy common sense. It is as important for the present-day religious as for the mediaevalist and the Church historian. 4 guineas

## EUSEBIUS OF CAESAREA

D. S. WALLACE-HADRILL, D.D.

Historians, philologists, geographers and biblical and dogmatic theologians are all united in regarding the works of Eusebius of Caesarea as pre-eminent among the 'sources' for the third-fourth century of the Christian Era. And yet no work of any importance on Eusebius has appeared in English for thirty years.
