

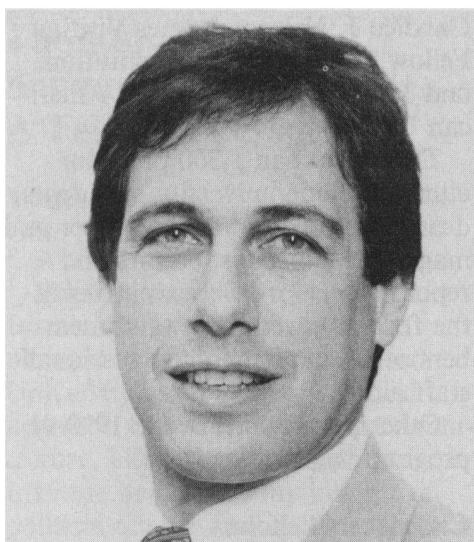
### Computer Users Organized Section

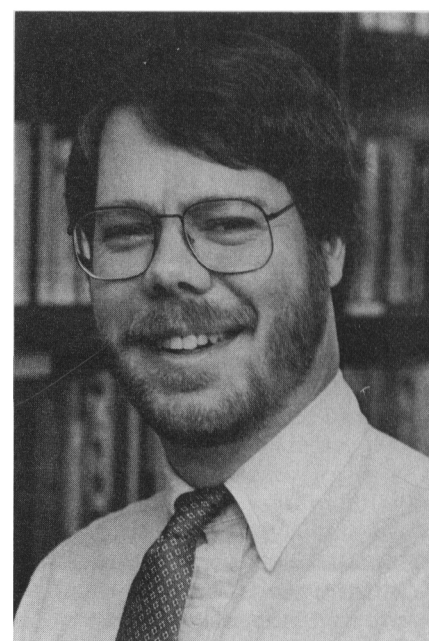
The new political science and journalism Fellows are:

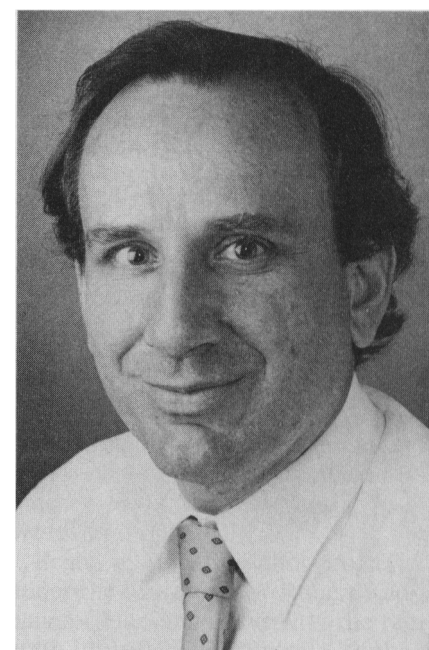
